

Quality Incentive Payment (QIP)

- QIP is designed to improve the quality and marketability of empty glass beverage containers collected for recycling.
- QIP provides fiscal incentives to registered curbside programs or other certified entities to improve the quality and marketability of empty glass beverage containers collected by registered curbside programs or dropoff or collection programs.
- CalRecycle may expend up to \$10 million annually for QIP payments. The QIP rate may be up to \$60 per ton, subject to availability of funds, for cleaned and color-sorted glass empty beverage containers.

Plastic Market Development Payment (PMDP)

- PMDP was created to develop California’s markets for recycled empty plastic beverage containers.
- CalRecycle pays up to \$150 per ton on a quarterly basis to specified entities for empty plastic beverage containers that are processed and utilized for manufacturing in this state.
- To qualify for PMDP: (1) A certified entity must wash and produce flake, pellet, or other form usable for a product manufacturer from empty California Refund Value (CRV) plastic beverage containers collected in the state for recycling; and (2) A product manufacturer using the plastic material from the certified entity to manufacture a plastic product in CA.

Curbside Supplemental Payment

- Curbside Supplemental Payment program is a supplemental payment to aid certified and registered operators of curbside programs and neighborhood drop off programs that accept all types of empty beverage containers for recycling.
- CalRecycle pays registered operators of curbside programs and drop off or collection programs, a total of \$15 million per fiscal year for empty beverage containers collected.
- The payments are calculated based upon the volume of beverage containers collected by programs during the 12-month calendar year and paid out to eligible participants the following year. The payments are to supplement the costs of associated with recycling purposes.
