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12. Legal Description of Facility:

Section 9 and 16, Township 1 North, Range 6 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian, County of San Joaquin.

13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the San Joaquin County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by CalRecycle in January 2012. The location of the facility is identified in the Nondisposal Facility Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by CalRecycle, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the enforcement agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. A Negative Declaration was filed with the State Clearinghouse (SCH #2007092056) and certified by CalRecycle on September 17, 2007. A Notice of Determination was filed with the State Clearinghouse on December 18, 2007. An addendum to the Negative Declaration was prepared by CalRecycle, dated March 2014, pursuant to Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Section 15164. The CEQA documents describe and support the design and operation which will be authorized by the issuance of this permit.

14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Hazardous, radioactive, medical (as defined in Chapter 6.1, Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code), liquid, designated, putrescible wastes (i.e. food waste from residents, restaurants, cafeterias, grocery stores, etc.), or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Report of Facility Information and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the enforcement agency.

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16. Self Monitoring:

The owner/operator shall submit the results of all self monitoring programs to the Enforcement Agency within 30 days of the end of the reporting period unless otherwise stated.

Program	Reporting Frequency
a. The types and quantities (in tons) of waste, including separated or commingled recyclables, and construction & demolition debris entering the facility per day.	Monthly
b. The number and types of vehicles using the facility per day.	Monthly
c. Results of the hazardous waste load checking program, including the quantities and types of hazardous wastes, medical wastes or otherwise prohibited wastes found in the waste stream and the disposition of these materials.	Maintain availability during EA monthly inspections
d. Copies of all complaints regarding this facility.	Within 24 hours of complaint
e. Copies of the operator's actions taken to resolve any complaints.	Within 7 days of complaint
f. Notify the enforcement agency via telephone or electronic mail of any special occurrences, such as fires, explosions, earthquakes, significant injuries, accidents or property damage, and all measures taken to address the incident.	Within 24 hours of the event

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17. Enforcement Agency (EA) Conditions:

- a. The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 14, California Code of Regulations (CCR).
- b. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, accidents, injuries and property damage, receipt or rejection of prohibited wastes, lack of sufficient number of personnel, flooding, earthquake damage and other unusual occurrences. Each log entry shall be accompanied by a summary of any actions taken by the operator to mitigate the occurrence. The log shall be available to site personnel and the EA during operating hours.
- c. All loads entering the facility shall undergo load checking in a manner that meets the approval of the EA. Trained load checkers shall be on-site to verify that received loads do not contain prohibited wastes. The operator shall keep records of training and load checks performed to meet the requirements.
- d. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the EA.
- e. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is: 500 tons per day (tpd) of Mixed Solid Waste; 1,500 tpd of Inert Type A Debris; and 200 tpd of Green Material, and shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit.
- f. This permit is subject to review by the EA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the EA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resources Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq. and associated regulations.
- g. The EA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
- h. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of an RFI amendment, to the EA at least 180 days in advance of the change.
- i. A copy of this permit and most recent TPR shall be maintained at the facility.
