**Summary of Request:**

Staff requests approval of Quincy Engineering, Inc. as Contractor for the Rubberized Asphalt Concrete (RAC) Engineering and Technical Assistance Contract.

Staff recommends that CalRecycle enter into a contract with Quincy Engineering, Inc. as Contractor for the Rubberized Asphalt Concrete Engineering and Technical Assistance Contract in an amount not to exceed \$1,825,000.



**Background Information, Analysis, and Findings:**

For the last six years, CalRecycle has been providing RAC engineering and technical assistance to local government agencies to increase their RAC knowledge base and to assist in the execution of RAC paving projects. The previous contractors, MACTEC Engineering and Consulting, and Jacobs Engineering Group, have provided training to hundreds of local government agencies on RAC specifications, material properties, and construction best management practices. In addition, these contractors have provided technical assistance ranging from specification review to construction management assistance on hundreds of RAC projects. The proposed tasks under this contract are similar to the previous contracts and the new contractor will continue to train agencies, provide technical assistance to ensure successful RAC projects, support CalRecycle's Rubber Pavement Grant Program, Green Roads effort, and the RAC Cooperative Purchasing Program. The current contract with Jacobs Engineering ends on May 15, 2012.

The Scope of Work for this contract (see Attachment 1) was approved on December 13, 2011 and staff was authorized to proceed with the contractor selection process. CalRecycle used the Request for Qualification (RFQ) process to choose Quincy Engineering, Inc. as the Contractor, which will be awarded in the amount not to exceed \$1,825,000. Proposed funding for this contract will come from the RAC Technical Assistance Contract line item for FYs 2011/12 and 2012/13 in the Market Development Section in the current (6<sup>th</sup> Edition) Five-Year Tire Plan.
