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12. Legal Description of Facility:

The legal description of this facility is contained in Section 1.3 of the Edwards AFB – Main Base Sanitary Landfill, Joint Technical Document dated September 2015.

13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the Kern County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by CalRecycle on February 25, 1998 and last amended on February 7, 2005. The location of the facility is identified in the (Countywide Siting Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by CalRecycle, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the enforcement agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. The Edwards AFB Fire Department has determined that the facility is in conformance with applicable fire standards, pursuant to PRC, 44151.
- e. A Mitigated Negative Declaration (SCH #93052089) was approved by the State Water Resources Control Board on August 12, 1993. The Negative Declaration described and supported the design and operation of this facility. A CATEX – Categorical Exclusion (AF Form 813) was filed with the State Clearing House on August 1, 1994 for the composting operation. A CATEX – Categorical Exclusion (AF Form 813) was prepared by Edwards AFB and approved on May 1, 2007, for the increase in tonnage, traffic elevation, design capacity, change in closure date and decrease in the disposal footprint. The Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) acting as Lead Agency prepared and circulated for review a Mitigated Negative Declaration (SCH #2009101037) which was adopted on November 4, 2009 and a Notice of Determination was filed on November 5, 2009.

14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting non-processed liquid waste sludge, designated waste, or hazardous waste, unless such waste is specifically described below, and unless the acceptance of such waste is authorized by all applicable permits. Universal Wastes, as defined in Title 22, California Code of Regulations, used motor oil, and other waste streams that have state approved alternative management standards may be accepted for recycling or offsite disposal purposes as described in the Report of Disposal Site Information and approved by the Local Enforcement Agency.

The permittee is additionally prohibited from the following items:

- a. Scavenging by the public;
- b. Disposal of pesticides;
- c. Burning of wastes or receipt of hot or combusting wastes or wood stove ashes;
- d. The salvaging of cosmetics, food, beverages, or any material capable of impairing public health; and
- e. Receipt of untreated medical wastes.

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16. Self Monitoring:

Except for the items a-c the owner/operator shall submit the results of all self monitoring programs to the Enforcement Agency within 30 days of the end of the reporting period (*for example, 1st quarter = January – March, the report is due by April 30, etc.. Information required on an annual basis shall be submitted with the 4th quarter monitoring report, unless otherwise stated.*)

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17. Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) Conditions:

- a. The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 14 and Title 27, California Code of Regulations.
- b. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous or unpermitted wastes, and significant injuries, accidents or property damage. The log shall be available for inspection by authorized representatives of the Local Enforcement Agency and CalRecycle during normal business hours.
- c. The operator shall provide written procedures, regarding landfill operations during severe weather conditions, to the Local Enforcement Agency for review annually.
- d. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the Local Enforcement Agency.
- e. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 510 tons per day, and shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit. Greenwaste tonnage shall be consistent with the September 2015 JTD, not exceeding 160 tons per day.
- f. This permit is subject to review by the Local Enforcement Agency and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the Local Enforcement Agency for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resource Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq. and associated regulations.
- g. The Local Enforcement Agency reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations when deemed necessary due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
- h. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of an RFI amendment, to the Local Enforcement Agency at least 180 days in advance of the change.
- i. A copy of this permit shall be maintained at the facility.
