

**13. Findings:**

- a. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) as required by Title 14, California Code of Regulations (CCR), Division 7, Chapter 6.
- b. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the Waste Tire Storage and Disposal Standards applicable to a Major waste tire facility, pursuant to PRC §42820 et. Seq. and implementing regulations found in 14 CCR, Division 7, Chapter 3.
- c. The issuance of this permit will not cause a physical change in the environment and there will be no permitted expansion of use at the facility. The issuance of this permit has been found to be Categorically Exempt (14, CCR, Section 15301.)

**14. Conditions:**

- a. The design and operation of this facility shall comply with the applicable Waste Tire Storage and Disposal Standards contained in 14 CCR, Division 7, Chapter 3. The permittee shall also comply with the permitting requirements in 14 CCR, Division 7, Chapter 6.
- b. This permit has been issued to the operator for the waste tire facility located at 520 Harbor Blvd and is not transferable to any other location (PRC §42808) and a copy of this permit shall be posted in a visible location at the facility at all times.
- c. Upon presentation of proper credentials, the Enforcement Agency, CalRecycle staff, or other authorized agent of CalRecycle, shall be allowed to enter the permitted facility during normal operating hours to examine and copy books, papers, records, or memorandum, to take photographs of the tire storage area, and to conduct inspections and investigations pertaining to the facility. CalRecycle staff, designated contractors and representatives shall also have access to the facility to investigate, remediate, or stabilize the facility, if such activities are deemed necessary to protect the public health, safety and the environment.

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## 15. Conditions: (continued)

- d. The permittee shall maintain a copy of the October 20, 2008 West Sacramento Fire Department approval at the facility. The permittee shall maintain copies of all waste & used tire manifests documenting tire movement in and out of the facility for a minimum of 3 years. The permittee shall maintain a copy of the Operation Plan and the Emergency Response Plan at the facility. At the time of permit issuance, the permittee shall forward a copy of the Emergency Response Plan to the local fire authority. The Emergency Response Plan shall be revised as necessary to reflect any changes in the operations of the waste tire facility or requirements of the local fire authority. Such revisions to the operation plan or emergency response plan will not be effective until CalRecycle concurs with the revisions. All emergency phone numbers shall be updated immediately. The local fire authority and CalRecycle shall be notified of any changes to the plan within 30 days of implementing the revision.
- e. Waste tires will only be in piles identified on the site plan on page 5 of this permit. The passenger tire equivalents of tires in each pile shall not exceed the following; Pile 1 – 5,000 PTE consisting of shredded tires only, Pile 2- 1,000 PTE, Pile 3 – 1,000 PTE, Pile 4 – 2,000 PTE, Pile 5 – 500 PTE, and Pile 6 – 500 PTE.
- f. Whole tires stored outside will be processed into shreds within 3 days of arriving on site or moved indoors. In the event of an unforeseen event that prevents tires from being processed into shreds within 3 days, the tires shall be stored on racks in rows of no more than 6 feet high with no more than two rows wide and covered with impermeable tarps in the event of rain.
- g. All site conditions, equipment, and precautions outlined in the Waste Tire Facility Operation Plan shall remain in force. In no case shall the permittee implement any change of permit conditions herein without first seeking approval from CalRecycle by submitting a written notice of the proposed change to the Enforcement Agency at least 90 days in advance of the change.
- h. All approvals referenced in this permit shall be maintained in force during the term of this permit. The 6 foot firewalls on site must be properly maintained. In the event the permittee intends to modify any permit or approval from another government program, including but not limited to Air Resources Board, State Water Control Board, West Sacramento Fire Department or CalRecycle programs, during the term of this permit, the permittee shall notify CalRecycle in writing within at least 30 days prior to the change and include copies of any renewed or modified permits or approvals from these agencies. In the event any permit or approval from another government program is suspended or revoked, or expires during the term of this permit, the permittee shall notify CalRecycle in writing within 5 working days of the suspension, revocation or expiration, and include copies of the pertinent documents with the notification.
- i. The permittee shall manifest all Tire Derived Product (TDP) loads, other than crumb rubber, or obtain written approval from CalRecycle prior to allowing the transport of TDP, as defined by PRC sections §42805.7 and §42950(i), pursuant to Title 14 CCR §18451. Requests for such approval shall include proof of sale. Failure to obtain approval of the transport of the product may result in enforcement action.
- j. The permittee must report to CalRecycle the receipt of 10 or more waste or used tires from unregistered haulers in a manner that is consistent with Title 14 CCR §18461.
- k. The permittee shall only give, contract, or arrange with California registered used and waste tire haulers to transport waste tires or tire pieces greater than 1/4" away from the facility, unless the hauler is exempt as specified in PRC §42954, or CalRecycle has granted written approval to the permittee or the hauler.
- l. Altered tire materials greater than 1/4" in size stored on-site are considered waste tires and will count toward the Maximum Permitted Capacity declared on page one of this permit.
- m. The permittee shall maintain a record of the total number of waste tires on-site measured once each month, and provide a quarterly report to CalRecycle containing that information in either electronic or written format.
- n. The beneficial reuse of waste tires in on-site construction projects must be pre-approved as required by Title 14 CCR §17346(f).
- o. The permittee shall maintain adequate financial assurance in accordance with the closure requirements of 14 CCR, Division 7, Chapter 6, Article 9 and operating liability in accordance with the requirements of 14 CCR, Division 7, Chapter 6, Article 10.
- p. The permittee shall submit an updated Closure Plan (Part B), CalRecycle form DRRR 504, as specified in 14 CCR, Division 7, Chapter 6, §18442, at least 120 days prior to the anticipated closure of the facility.

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- q. CalRecycle staff reserves the right to suspend or modify waste tire receiving and/or storage operations when deemed necessary due to an emergency, a potential health hazard or the creation of a public nuisance, to protect the public health and safety, protect and rehabilitate or enhance the environment, or to mitigate adverse environmental impacts.
- r. In the event of a fire or other emergency that may have potential significant off-site effects, the permittee shall notify CalRecycle within 24 hours.
- s. The permittee will maintain and ensure that all emergency equipment is in working order.
- t. The permittee must maintain drain inserts to ensure they are capable of capturing debris, oils and sediment. Utilize drain inlet protection, such as straw wattle.
- u. Violation of any term or condition of this permit or the Waste Tire Storage and Disposal Standards may result in enforcement action(s) which include but are not limited to the following: issuance of orders (clean up and abatement or cease and desist); penalties (civil, administrative, criminal); and permit revocation or suspension.
- v. This permit does not release the permittee from their responsibility under any other existing laws, ordinances, regulations, or statutes of other government agencies.
- w. The terms and conditions of this permit may change as a result of a revision of CalRecycle's statutes or regulations.

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
