The monthly meeting begins at 10:00 AM in the Coastal Hearing Room located at: CalEPA 1001 I St. Sacramento, CA 95814. *The CIWMP Enforcement Policy Workshop will start following the Tire Fund Reallocation Workshop, also being held within the MMLA meeting. The Tire Fund Reallocation Workshop could go longer than 11:00 a.m. However, the CIWMP Enforcement Policy would not start before 11:00 a.m. if the Tire Fund Reallocation workshop ends early.*

2. Legislative reasons for making Policy updates:
 - Overview of 2001 update that was due to SB 1066
 - Overview of current update that is due to SB 1016
 - Review specific changes
 - Discuss any stakeholder comments related to proposed changes

Following this public workshop, staff may further revise the CIWMP Enforcement Policy Part II document. All proposed recommendations will be posted on the CalRecycle Public Notices website by June 15th. Final changes will be incorporated and posted no later than June 30, 2010.

BACKGROUND:

In August 2001, the California Integrated Waste Management Board adopted a revised "Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan Enforcement Policy Part II" as the basis for determining whether or not a jurisdiction has adequately implemented its Source Reduction and Recycling Element (SRRE) and Household Hazardous Waste Element (HHWE), including the diversion programs described therein. This is the core guidance document that staff uses in preparing recommendations regarding a jurisdiction's performance for the Department of Resources Recycling and Recycling's (CalRecycle) consideration.

This document is being updated strictly to reflect the passage and implementation of Senate Bill 1016 (Chapter 343, Statutes of 2008), which changed the measurement system from one based on estimated generation and diversion to one based on actual per-capita disposal. Additionally, references to the Board have been changed to CalRecycle as appropriate. SB 1016 did not change the diversion goals of AB 939, or the manner in which CalRecycle evaluates a jurisdiction's performance. The revised document adds the new disposal measurement system, removes references to the biomass diversion credit, and removes references to SB 1066, which has expired.
