RE: Report on Emergency Waiver Issued for Benton Crossing Landfill

Dear Ms. Kearney:

The County wishes to submit the following report on the Emergency Waiver issued on April 14, 2015.

1. The daily amount of disaster debris received, diverted, and disposed at the facility;

All disaster debris that was delivered to Benton Crossing Landfill will be diverted. The debris was inert material, primarily soil, rock and concrete. Some of the material included imbedded steel. The material has been stockpiled at the site and the County has prepared an RFP for aggregate crushing services to process the entirety of the debris to a specification of ¾" minus, allowing for the recycling and re-use of the material as road base, wet weather operations pads and access roads, and final cover foundation layer.

*The total amount of disaster debris received at Benton Crossing Landfill, and is now scheduled for diversion was **4,713.80 tons**.*

2. The jurisdiction of origin for the disaster debris received at the facility;

The jurisdiction of origin for all disaster related debris is Unincorporated Mono County.

3. The increase in tonnage or volume of waste received per day during the effective period of the activated waiver;

The disaster debris was hauled to the Benton Crossing Landfill over the period between March 31 and April 30, 2015. The majority of the waste came in a three week period between April 6th-April 24, when the disaster debris increased our normal daily tonnage by approximately 300 tons per day. Outside of that period, the increase was less than 100 tons per day.

4. The facilities used to process the disaster debris.

There were no facilities used to process the disaster debris. All debris was processed for hauling at the individual sites. The processing that is anticipated in the coming weeks will occur at Benton Crossing Landfill, with equipment brought in by a contractor hired to perform the crushing of the material.
