
Photo Report City of Firebaugh 2/16/11, 2/17/11, and 4/11/11

A) Residential Curbside Diversion Program

During CalRecycle staff's 2011 site visits, staff visually verified the City of Firebaugh's performance of its Local Implementation Plan.



Photo 1: During staff's site visits, about 75 percent of households set out recycling carts. In comparison, before the Compliance Order, about 15 percent of households participated in recycling.

Photo 2: The City's hauler collected and processed the residential recyclables consistently. When the hauler unloaded these recyclables at the materials recovery facility, they had minimal contamination.



B) Commercial Diversion Program



Photo 1: All businesses either had their own recycling bins or shared recycling bins with other businesses. During staff's site visits, many of the City's commercial recycling bins were full of clean recyclables.

Photo 2: When the City's hauler unloaded the City's commercial recyclables at the materials recovery facility, they were very clean, with minimal contamination.



C) Agricultural/Industrial Diversion Program




Photo 1: Agricultural/industrial locations generally separated their materials effectively and provided clean recyclables. All agricultural/industrial locations either had their own recycling containers or shared recycling containers with other businesses.

D) City Office and City Building Diversion Program

Photo 1: City Hall staff had received and were using personal recycling bins.

Photo 2: During one site visit, City Hall's recycling bin demonstrated good source separation.

Photo 3: However, during another site visit, City Hall's recycling bin was contaminated. This might suggest the involvement of passersby from the adjacent park or the need for continued education.



E) Schools Diversion Program



Photos 1 & 2: The schools provided clean source-separated recyclables through both its bins (*Photo 1*) and its carts (*Photo 2*).
