Though his tenure with the board was but eight years, his contribution both to the board and to waste management was significant.

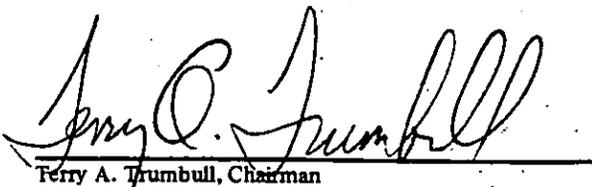
He was a pioneer and leader in the state's program to convert waste into energy. His leadership charted the course the state is now taking in converting waste into energy.

This resolution speaks for all board members and for the board's staff in extending condolences to Army's family upon his passing. He will be missed by all.

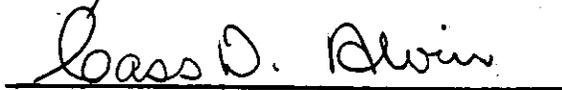

WHEREAS, SB 1346 (Presley, 1982), authorized the Board to maintain and publish a State List of Non-Complying Waste Facilities; and

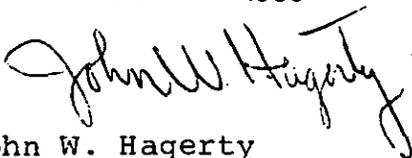
